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

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The project **“Iguatats Connectades (Equality Connected). Intersectionality in local public policies”** is co-funded by the Program for Rights, Equality and Citizenship of the European Commission and implemented by the City of Terrassa, the University of Vic – Central University of Catalonia (UVic-UCC) and CEPS Projectes Socials. The starting point is the need to find new ways of intervening and planning that allow for **more comprehensive and appropriate responses** to the complexity of reality and people.

In this context, the project proposes **to apply the intersectional approach in non-discrimination local public policies**, a perspective that has been highly theorized but with few practical experiences in the field of equality public policies. For this reason a pilot test of the intersectional approach, of a practical nature, will be developed in the City of Terrassa.

The project, carried out between January 2018 and June 2019, draws on **previous experiences** developed in other European municipalities and will contribute to generating new tools to apply this perspective in other contexts.

The project includes different actions:

- ✓ Training cycle for the staff of the City of Terrassa that works the axes of inequality and life cycles.
- ✓ Cycle of awareness-raising workshops and knowledge exchange with entities and professionals working in social, health, and education, as well as other interested persons.
- ✓ Cycle of work sessions to specify the application of intersectionality, based on the reflections and conclusions drawn from the training and awareness-raising cycles.
- ✓ European Congress to facilitate the international transfer of apprenticeships.
- ✓ Dissemination of results events.

All this will enable a process of applied reflection that will materialize in a collection of resources, with the idea that the experience is transferable to other European cities.
